Two-seater sofa designed by Isamu Kenmochi, circa late 1960s.

This sofa embodies the elegance of Japanese modernist design. Its bentwood structure draws a continuous line between the armrests and the base, creating a fluid and balanced silhouette. The generous seat, padded and upholstered in a textured green fabric, provides both comfort and understated style.

Isamu Kenmochi reinterprets traditional Japanese seating forms with a contemporary touch, characteristic of the 1960s and 70s. A fine example of harmony between craftsmanship and modern design.
